WHAT IS THE CCPH?

The Collaborative Centre for Prostate Health Inc is an interdisciplinary group of clinicians from the three major teaching hospitals in Adelaide. It also includes epidemiologists, scientists, representatives of the State Cancer Registry, the AntiCancer Foundation and consumer organisations. It holds an annual research meeting and is involved with a large number of collaborative projects on prostate disease.

OBJECTIVES OF THE COLLABORATION

- to promote collaboration between individuals and organisations working in prostate disease
- to promote community awareness and understanding of prostate disease.
- to facilitate research, education and training in prostate disease

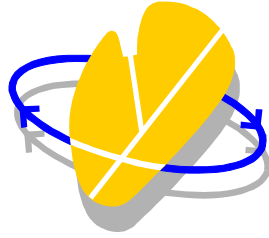
